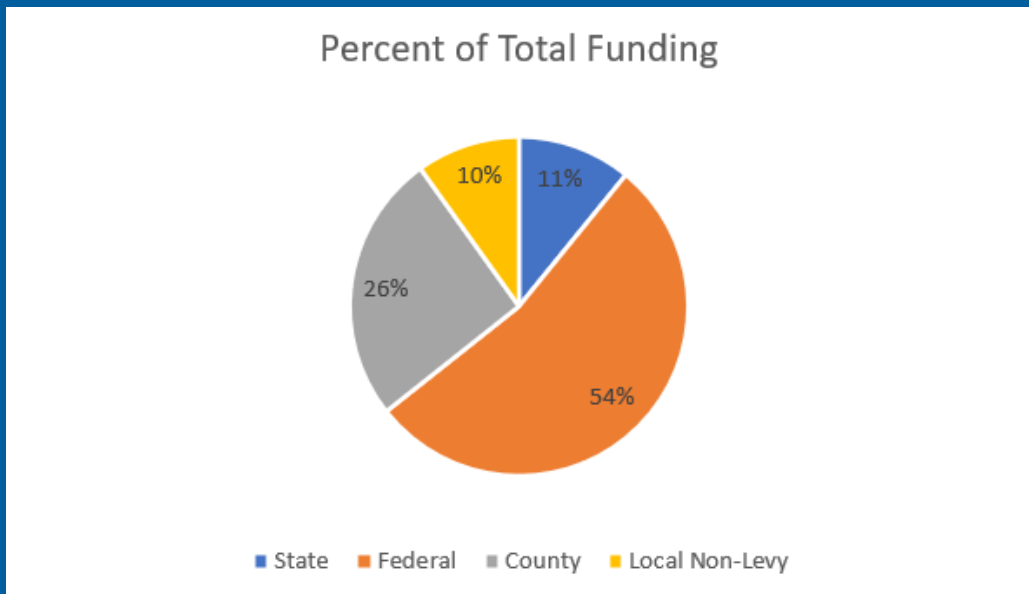

GOAL THREE

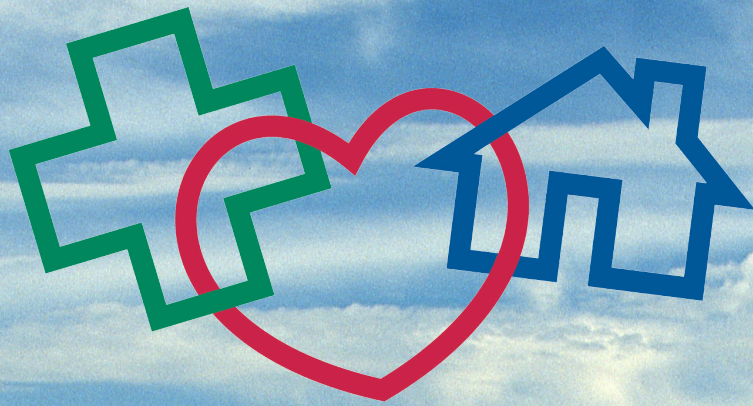
Custer Health will improve health literacy (inclusive of COVID-19) in 50% of services provided.
